ABOUT THE ROLE

The Technical Department is The Events Centre's front line for the provision of technical services for all shows, events and functions held at The Events Centre. The Technical Department is responsible for ensuring the back of house facilities and equipment are safe, well maintained and fit for purpose.

The primary role of the Senior Theatre Technician (Audiovisual) is to effectively deliver technical services to clients of The Events Centre, specifically in the audio and visual disciplines; to assist with maintenance to all relevant technical equipment; and to lead and assist other technical staff as needed.

RESPONSIBILITIES

People

- Supervise, train and mentor theatre technicians, contractors, and clients in the correct use of audio and video equipment.
- Provide exceptional consumer-facing service to support the operational needs of clients.
- Share knowledge and experience with others about the configuration and operation of venue facilities, equipment, processes, and systems.

Operations

- Operate audio and video equipment for live events and internet streams as required, to a high standard.
- Coordinate and facilitate the day-to-day safe setup, pack down, and configuration of professional audio and video equipment to suit operational and client requirements.
- Maintain and troubleshoot audio and video systems and equipment venue-wide, performing or arranging repairs in conjunction with the Technical Manager as required.
- Perform technical department housekeeping and maintenance to ensure world-class presentation and safety of backstage areas.
- Perform and participate in risk assessment processes on technical and venue-wide undertakings.
- Operate and maintain effective systems for storing, accessing, editing, and distributing technical planning documentation along with other facility information and records.
- Perform other technical shifts including BOH Supervisor, Flyman and Mechanist as required.

Administration

- Work in conjunction with the Production Coordinator and provide technical advice to assist in the billing, planning and delivery of world-class technical services and outcomes for customers.
- Plan, document, implement and review system standards, processes and procedures in-line with best practices and ease-of-use principles.
- Provide advice to the Technical Manager as to new technologies and equipment the venue might pursue.
- Assist in the development and implementation of venue policies and procedures.
- Promptly update records to include customer feedback, resource utilisation and condition reports.

NOTE: An employee may be directed to carry out such duties as are within the limits of the employee's skill, competence, and training.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Essential

- Demonstrated 5 years minimum experience in the operation and configuration of professional audio-visual equipment in a live production environment.
- A high level of competency in operating large format digital audio consoles in live situations, with demonstrated experience in live music and theatre settings.
- Extensive experience in delivering and operating AV projection systems, including ATEM switching, Black Magic video, camera operation, live streaming and playback.
- Extensive computer skills in PowerPoint, QLab, Keynote, Office as well as basic networking skills.
- The ability to interpret technical plans and designs.
- An understanding of the importance of quality customer service.
- Understanding and execution of relevant workplace health and safety principles.
- Availability and commitment to undertake work on weekends, public holidays and after-hours as required.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills and the ability to work autonomously, as well working effectively as part of a team.

- The ability to lift and carry safely.
